

Fraud Alert

Corporate frauds have become rampant. We, at Reliance Life Sciences, have observed a trend wherein certain fraudsters have been approaching innocent job seekers and promising them lucrative job offers in our company. Once a potential applicant is taken into confidence, these fraudsters ask them to make payments to a designated bank account, quoting many mandatory preludes to the actual appointment or interview.

Here is how it works:

- The first payment demands are generally of small amounts so that the aspirant is not alerted.
- The fraudster then slowly increases the amount as the dates come closer to the designated interview or appointment.
- At times large amounts are demanded on the pretext of providing initial startup kit, for instance a laptop.
- Besides money, these fraudsters also seek personal information to process the application. This data is later sold in the market.

Through this Fraud Alert we wish to caution the potential job seekers that Reliance Life Sciences does not ask any job applicant to deposit money for any reason.

- Reliance Life Sciences does not appoint any agent, agency or individual, to make or issue offers of employment or benefits on its behalf.
- Reliance Life Sciences does not charge any job seeker any money for employment
